Students wishing to take part in the Haiti Tag Day should bring in one (\$1) dollar for each piece of clothing they wear (up to \$5) that is not a part of the uniform dress code. If you pay by check please make checks out to SJN and note in the bottom corner Haiti. Remember TAG stands for *Teaching About Giving*. The news report says that 25¢ a day will provide food and water for one person. Children understand the value of 25¢, and they can grasp the concept of using it to buy food and water. If you donate the \$1 for your child to change out portions of their uniform, have your child take money from their piggy bank to donate to help other children.

No belt = \$1



Wear your favorite shirt = \$1



Wear your favorite pants/jeans/skirts = \$1



Wear your favorite socks



Wear your favorite shoes (socks must be worn with sandals, no flip flops) = \$1

Remember that all clothes must be regulation length and suitable to wear to school. Growing spurts happen quickly and students may have grown an inch or two in height or girth so double check those fun clothes.
